Know everything about the delta flight attendant hijacker

Delta Flight 386, which boarded on Friday, June 4, 2021, was highlighted in the headlines due to the unusual emergency landing. All the news channels ran stories about the "delta flight attendant hijacker." The people on the plane and those watching the updates of the happenings on their televisions were both afraid. The Los Angeles International Airport had seen the takeoff of the flight to Nashville. Six staff or flight attendants and 162 passengers were traveling on board Delta Flight 386.

What happened?

The flight took off smoothly, just like any other trip before the **delta flight attendant hijacker** situation. For the three-hour trip, passengers were boarding. However, during the flight, a passenger unexpectedly jumped in and attempted to take over the control panel. A third row passenger on the airplane also put a video online with information on what transpired during the flight.

The suspect appeared to be unprovoked, according to the video. He simply stood up from his seat and sprinted over to the pilot's cabin, where he banged on the cockpit door.

However, a different passenger jumped into action, knocked the man down, and then held him against the ground. The entire process of restraint was then assisted by a Delta crew using zip ties.

Christopher Williams, a flight attendant, acted quickly and zip-tied the man's hands and ankles. He also held him down for about 20 minutes. Keep reading to know more regarding the **delta flight attendant hijacker** story.

It was terrible, but our Delta flight attendant Christopher Williams responded promptly, a passenger by the name of Jessica Robertson twitter. "Several other passengers in my neighborhood also did so. Although we're secure, we're still in Albuquerque. I hope Chris receives all the praise and bonuses he merits from @delta."

Around 2.20 pm, the aircraft made an emergency landing at the Albuquerque International Sunport. The man in the viral video footage of the event was detained by airport authorities. The hijacker is seen being removed by the authorities in the video. He repeatedly shouted, "Stop this plane."

After the hijacker was removed from the flight, other passengers felt secure and at ease. After the passengers waited for hours in Albuquerque, Delta Airlines later arranged other plans for the stranded travelers to travel to Nashville. Two Nashville-based music industry professionals, Wes and Tracy Campbell, were also on board. Tracy, who recognized the crew, also described the entire **delta flight attendant hijacker** scenario.

She claimed that the attacker "was without a doubt after the cockpit." Additionally, this sweet flight attendant was actually pushing him away. She also added, "We didn't truly know what was going on. I simply shouted, "Holy crap! Two men are fighting.. This is not 9/11, after all. It has been a while. Though everything happens in nanoseconds.

"My office will continue to aggressively prosecute federal offenses in the skies and guarantee the safety of the flying public," Delta Airlines said in a statement that praised the passengers and the crew of flight 386.

Reaction on social media

The passenger-shot video from **delta flight attendant hijacker** quickly gained popularity on social media sites like Twitter. People on twitter had respect for flight attendants as a result of this incident.

On social media, a lot of other passengers have commended flight attendant Christopher for acting quickly and decisively to save everyone's lives. The hijacker of the Delta flight who used zip ties is featured in a large number of YouTube videos. A similar Reddit thread also gained a lot of attention. The heroic actions of Christopher Williams have received wide recognition.
